Our Behaviour Expectations at Dane Court

At Dane Court we hope that everyone who is part of the school will achieve high standards in their work, feel that they are known and cared for, and contribute to making the school a lively and happy place. Good behaviour helps to make sure that these things are achieved.

What is good behaviour?

- Showing respect and being polite and considerate to others, including people who may not be your friends;
- Taking care of school property, buildings and classrooms, and the property of other people;
- Making sure that you have good relationships with all adults who work in the school;
- Being orderly and co-operative around the school;
- Being orderly and co-operative in lessons so that you can learn well, and so that teachers can help all students.

Always act in the same way towards others as you would like others to act towards you.

- As well as behaviour concerning people and property, behaviour concerning all school rules is equally important;
- Members of Dane Court are expected, for example, to wear school uniform smartly, bring correct books and equipment to lessons, and carry out homework;
- Be polite, considerate and have a positive attitude to school rules.

How do we achieve and maintain good behaviour?

- By expecting everyone to be responsible for their own actions;
- By expecting everyone to conduct themselves in and around the school in a way which will bring credit;
- By being helpful and fair towards everyone and expecting helpfulness and fairness in return.

Staff will help students to achieve good behaviour.

- By praising good behaviour and work;
- By using clear sanctions if students do not react positively to improve unsatisfactory conduct, making it clear that while everyone is different good behaviour is expected from all.
